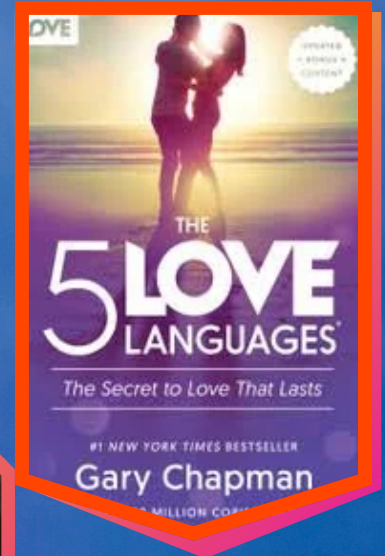

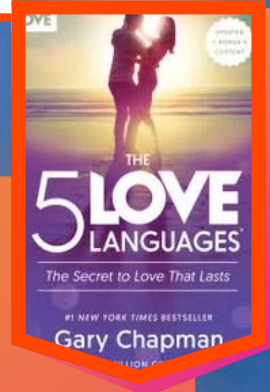

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Married couples, engaged couples, siblings, friends and all!

According to 1 Corinthians 13, love is more than sexual. God wants us to love each other. He commands us to love our neighbors, friends, family and even our enemies.

It is expressed, according to the New Testament Greeks, that Strong Love- Family Love, Philios Love- Brotherly Love, Agape Love- Unconditional Love and Eros Love- Sexual Love. Learning how to love each other is the greatest gesture of love we can give each other regardless of the relationship. This time together helps us to understand this basic principle about how human beings are wired to express their love and how human beings are wired to receive love.

1. Words of Affirmation – Expressing love through verbal appreciation, compliments, encouragement, and affirming statements.
2. Quality Time – Showing love by giving undivided attention, engaging in meaningful conversations, and participating in shared activities.
3. Receiving Gifts – Demonstrating love through thoughtful, meaningful gifts that symbolize care and appreciation.
4. Acts of Service – Expressing love by performing helpful tasks that ease the partner's burdens.
5. Physical Touch – Communicating love through physical gestures such as hugging, kissing, holding hands, or other forms of affectionate contact.

Chapman emphasizes that each person has a primary and secondary love language, and people often express love in the way they prefer to receive it.

Misunderstandings can occur when our love languages differ, such as performing acts of service that are not recognized as love by someone whose primary language is words of affirmation.
